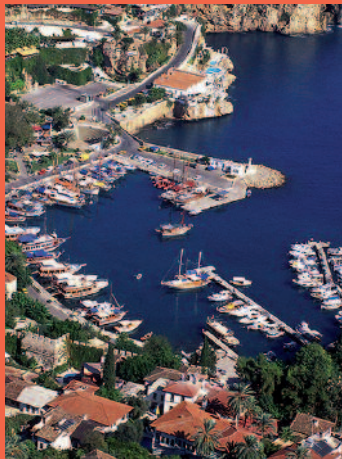


Sail the Turkish Coast

ITINERARY

Day 1: Antalya / Kemer (D)

After meeting your expert captain and his friendly crew at Setur Marina in Antalya and boarding the gulet-style yacht, you may enjoy a dinner (except late arrival) and toast your drinks while viewing sunset. Spend a relaxing night at the marina before starting your voyage.

Day 2: Olympos / Adrasan (BLD)

We begin our cruise along the craggy Mediterranean turquoise coast and stop at Olympos. After lunch onboard you may visit the ruins of ancient city of Olympos, before continuing to the bay of Adrasan where you will have dinner and a night's rest on the tranquil turquoise waters.

Day 3: Adrasan / Demre / Gokkaya (BLD)

After breakfast we sail to a bay in Demre, for a leisurely day. There's time for a swim or disembark and take the optional excursion to the Byzantine church dedicated to Saint Nicholas and the nearby theater and rock tombs of Myra. In the afternoon, we cruise to nearby coves of Gokkaya for dinner and spend the night.

Day 4: Gokkaya / Uçagiz (BLD)

We will cruise along the spectacular coastal scenery to the small fishing village of Uçagiz surrounded by a panoramic landscape and lacy coastline. There you can attend to an optional excursion in order to discover Saklikent which literally means hidden city and, a deep flowing canyon.

Day 5: Uçagiz / Kekova (BLD)

Morning hike to the Genovese castle and walk across the village of Kekova to see the old mason houses of the village along side with the conspicuous Lycian house-tombs carved into the cliffs and the submerged ruins of sunken ancient city of Simena. Dinner and an overnight in Kekova.

Day 6: Kekova / Phaselis (BLD)

Depart early in the morning for the Genovese Harbor. You will have a full day to explore the nearby cove of Sazak and swim in the crystal blue waters of the cove. There you will be served lunch and dinner and stay overnight. Why not sleep on deck beneath the stars if the night is clear?

Day 7: Phaselis / Kemer or Antalya (BLD)

After breakfast, we will set off this morning to the glittering coasts of Phaselis, where you will have an opportunity to swim and view the many ancient structures of Phaselis while strolling through the colonnaded streets of the ancient city. After lunch, continue to Antalya (or Kemer) for dinner and spend your last night in the marina.

Day 8: Departure (B)

Disembarkation after breakfast. Transfer provided to either airport or hotel.

GULET CRUISES

The Turkish gulet is a traditionally designed motorized wooden sailing vessel. They are descendants of ancient wooden boats which have sailed across the Aegean and Mediterranean seas for thousands of years fishing and trading among ancient civilisations.

Itinerary: Your gulet will typically travel in the morning, anchor in a small cove and spend the rest of the day in the area. Boat itineraries cannot be written in stone. They are subject to change due to weather and the captain's judgement. This is truly a trip designed for passengers who can go with the flow!

Sightseeing: Unlike land tours, there is no guided sight-seeing on these cruises. However, there are numerous opportunities to visit ancient sites along the way. Any cost incurred for transportation and entrance fees to the sites will be assumed by the passengers. Round trip transfers are provided from the airport to the marina where you will board your gulet.

Cabins: They are small, but functional with private bathroom. There is only one double bed in all cabins (one bed for two). No bath, but a sink and hand held shower.

Meals: All meals are included. They are simple, but delicious with fresh fruits and vegetables. 12.5 litres of water is provided daily, as is coffee and tea with breakfast, all other drinks are additional. Just as in a restaurant, alcohol brought on board will be charged a nominal corkage fee.

Crew: Consists of a captain, cook and a deckhand. They are very fluent in Turkish and sign language! No English.

And... Don't forget your towels and bathing suits to explore those sunken cities along the coast! Our charming gulet is not a luxury vessel, but as comfortable and relaxing as the little clothing you will need.

Charter your own gulet: You have the option of enjoying the ultimate freedom and chartering your own gulet. You decide in advance the size of the boat and the course it will charter. Your crew will cook 3 meals a day and clean the boat daily. You have the choice of either providing the groceries or simply paying the crew in advance and they will do the shopping and cooking for you. The idea is to relax and enjoy. So you will only motor approximately 2-3 hours per day. So be realistic about distances you will be covering when planning your voyage.
